Timber Route/Traffic Calming

- Gerry & Louise local residents at Craighaugh -present to discuss issues around timber bypass, and impact on their experience living in the village since last November and her ongoing communication with James England. Most recently an email to all haulers explain that penalites will be applied if bypass not utilised
- Gerry commented that haulage traffic has reduced in her opinion.
- Land and Forest Scotland Civil Engineer responsible for works; Timber Route has been repaired
- Suggestion speed limits or road narrowing pavements within village could help

- **Action**: Email to representative to Timber Transport Representative james.england@dumgal.gov.uk to invite him (and Timber Forum members) to a special meeting, and establish a collaborative approach with all community groups.
- **Action:** Dennis has taken photos to raise question of pavement narrowing for traffic calming and ask about speed reduction from 30mph to 20mph

Resilience Planning

- Couple of residents have taken up water assistance in recent heat wave.
- Barry updated from Environmental Health who are keen to know who is effected
- Scottish Water to bring water to Harthill depot in Lockerbie
- Help is available, if there is holding tank at your property they will top up tank.
- £800 grant per household available to improve your system e.g to create holding tank
- Significant fund available for resilience £19K ringfenced from Minska Fund need to discuss further with other groups.
